TABLE TOP WORKSHOP GREAT SUCCESS!!!

Over 60 club members, including several new members, attended the all day workshop on August 6 at the Science Resource Center at the Heard. Members divided into groups to learn at nine different work stations set up throughout the SRC and everyone enjoyed a free lunch courtesy of the club.

Irwin Lightstone, friend of the club, taught macro and micro photography. For post processing, Irwin uses a focus stacking program to combine all of his images (up to 99) to make a perfectly sharp final image.

Several Heard NPC Board members and club members worked at other stations to teach camera settings and techniques: **Larry Petterborg**, editor of the club newsletter, shared how to obtain the correct depth of field and focus. **Terree Stone**, co-vice-president, worked the light panel station teaching how to arrange flowers on a light panel and how to obtain good depth of field and focus for each subject.

Anita Oakley, co-vice president, worked the still life and abstract station helping members arrange seashells, sea glass, and other items in sand for a pleasing composition. **Peter Gilbert**, secretary, worked the oil on water station advising on camera settings and techniques. **Rob Hull**, webmaster, brought his splash photography gear giving members a chance to freeze frame peppers, lemons and apples as they splashed into the water.

Mike Cameron, club member, taught members all about how to photograph birds and discussed his settings and gear. **Jack Twiggs**, co-field trip leader, showed members the CamRanger technology as well as the Better Beamer. **Lee Hatfield**, co-field trip leader and organizer of the workshop, shared light painting techniques and camera settings.

Jackie Ranney, photo contest coordinator, and **Gaby Pruitt**, member, made sure everyone was signed in at the membership desk.




