Window to the Wild - Bird experience

Hutchins, TX – south of Dallas

Saturday, October 7th 8am

Cost: \$25 per person



Window to the Wild is a company dedicated to training wildlife for public education. They use the natural instinctive behavior of birds for striking performances and to educate about conservation. We will have the

opportunity to photograph birds in flight. We will be photographing birds as the trainers work with them and afterwards we will tour Rogers Wildlife Rehabilitation Center and have the opportunity to photograph some of the birds that are currently being treated. Rogers is one of the few facilities in the metroplex that specializes in rescue and rehabilitation of sick, injured and orphaned birds; as well as a sanctuary for those birds that are deemed non-releasable due to injuries. If weather turns rainy, this outing will be rescheduled for another time. I will be contacting those who have signed up with any updates.

You must sign up for this field trip - I have to give them a head count before the trip

Fossil Rim Wildlife Center

Saturday, October 21 [meet at entry 8:30 am]

\$25.95 per person (over 62 get a 10% discount, additional discounts available – check the link at the bottom of the article).

Animal feed - \$7 per bag — only one per vehicle

Fossil Rim is the first facility of its kind to have been accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association. Fossil Rim Wildlife Center participates in a worldwide network of wildlife conservation organizations working to restore the delicate balance between people, animals and the environment; with more than 1,100 animals, including 50-plus species of native and non-native animals living peacefully at the 1,800-acre park. The drive through the park takes between two to four hours – approximately 9 miles. You will be photographing from your vehicle. Most of the animals know the drill (car means food) and will walk up to your vehicle, so I would make sure you have a wide angle as well as your long lens with you. There is a café a little over half way through the park and we'll stop there for refreshments and bathroom break. They have a children's petting zoo area with animals that you can pet at the café area as well as hummingbird feeders.


