Guest Speaker: Mital Patel

Our guest speaker for our January meeting is Mital Patel, a Dallas-based photographer, who has really come into his own in the past few years.

Mital has been taking pictures since he was 12, when he was first gifted a camera from his father, who was the family's official photographer. He took over from his father as family photographer and also took pictures for his community. It was during family vacations that he found his passion for landscape photography. His primary photographic discipline was still centered on family for almost 20 years. It was when his children started school that his photography took a more intentional approach, and it carried over into his life.

He started taking regular nature hikes with camera in tow, the challenge a little greater with each new adventure. At the same time, Mital also started logging more hours in the digital world, using social media to talk shop with other photographers.

Eventually, online connections led to real-world creative exchanges in cities and remote regions of the world, where he and his new connections found perches to set up cameras and be humbled by the epicness of the natural world. He has spent hundreds of hours gazing at stunning expanses of earth, sea, and sky and trying to relay those memories to a broader community through his photography. It never gets old, and he always has a new destination in mind.

His presentation will showcase a recent trip to Greenland – with pictures of the country's landscape, including icebergs and the people in their daily lives. He will have stories to tell about how he set up and photographed his images, along with the challenges he faced. He will also share some tips on traveling there, for those who might be interested in contemplating this as a future destination!

New HNP Member: Craig Rowen

I'm not sure if, last spring, Craig Rowen had just learned of the Heard Nature Photographers, or if, having retired, he finally had some time to participate. Either way, he decided to check us out. I guess he liked what he saw, because he promptly joined and had become an active member. He's been to most of our regular meetings, and field trips, and post-field trip luncheons since joining.

Like Kathy Ledzius, who was featured as a new member back in February, Craig hails from northwestern Indiana. His "first exposure to photography" (Sorry, I couldn't resist the sorry old photographic play on words.) came after he joined the Army and left Indiana. For a time, he was stationed in Germany where he had an opportunity to take a darkroom-based photography class. He learned to develop black and white film, and he played with color photography before being transferred. But, by then, he was already hooked. He could not afford a 35mm SLR at the time, so he was content using a small 110-format film camera with 24 frames per cartridge.

After finishing his "extended vacation" with the Army, he attended Purdue University and graduated with a degree in engineering. He took a job with Texas Instruments and came to the Lonestar State in 1974. With a real job, he could finally afford a 35mm camera, and he settled on a Canon AE-1. He still has that camera and the lenses he bought for it. Later, he bought an Olympus XA pocket 35mm film camera just to have something convenient to carry around. He primarily shot color slides, and those were mostly of his family.

Craig's initial foray into digital photography was with small, early, point-and-shoot cameras back around the turn of the millennium: first, some flavor or early Nikon Coolpix followed by a Canon PowerShot A95. He eventually got a Canon EOS Rebel T1i. He currently shoots with a Canon EOS 70D. He also shoots with his cell phone. Now that he is a dyed-in-the-wool digital guy, he prefers to shoot raw images which he edits in Adobe Lightroom and Adobe Photoshop. He enjoys sharing his images electronically, but he also enjoys printing his images.

Craig's primary photographic interests are nature, landscape, macro/micro, and night photography. He also enjoys walk-arounds and shooting cityscapes. In terms of moving to a new level with his photography, he is interested in improving his in-camera composition.

If you're at one of our regular meetings or on one of our field trips, Craig will probably be there. He's friendly and easy to talk to. So, reach out and welcome him to the Heard Nature Photographers and get acquainted.



Here is how Paul was able to capture this image: "I had the good fortune to spend 3 weeks in the bush a couple years ago with some buddies. Saw lots of everything except only a few cheetahs. This shot of a leopard was captured in South Africa near Kruger National Park. While it was dusty I did amplify it a bit by applying a texture layer in PS which also applied the vignette effect. Shot with a Nikon D3S, 70-200 at ISO 5600."

Thanks to all the club members for submitting an outstanding group of images. I honestly don't know how we manage to choose a winner every year.
