Ron and Sharlott are members of both the Heard Nature Photographers Club and the Plano Photography Club. They are both award winning and published nature, night and wildlife photographers who combine their love of travel with their passion for photography. They have traveled to approximately 60 countries so far. They judge photography contests, make photography presentations for area photography clubs and teach photography classes at clubs and for the University of North Texas Osher Lifelong Learning Institute. They are both career educators. Ron retired from The University of North Texas as emeritus professor of marketing and logistics. Sharlott retired from teaching at Little Elm Elementary School. They are honorary life members of the Nature Conservancy which has more than one million members and has protected 120,000,000 acres of land and thousands of miles of rivers worldwide.

Ron and Sharlott will be presenting on "Photographing Wildlife in the Pantanal Region of Brazil". Their primary goal of the trip was to photograph jaguars, but they came away with much more than that! They will cover images and experiences of photographing jaguars, ocelots and tapirs to caimans, giant river otters and many tropical birds. Also covered will be tips and techniques for taking pictures from a small boat with fast moving subjects and quickly changing light conditions.


During this trip, they took more than 12,000 images each, as their subjects were birds in flight and quickly moving animals. Ron and Sharlott will discuss handling large numbers of images in the field, and then walk us through the sort and delete process before editing. Suggestions for editing in Lightroom and Photoshop, including dealing with the noise from very low light conditions will be reviewed.

It's that time of year again when we all are in search of Fall colors and cooler temperatures; believe it or not we have some places that have foliage displaying those lovely fall colors here in Texas. You can check out the locations below known for fall color. From past trips we know that fall color can be hard to predict, so please call ahead if you are planning to visit any of these locations.

I've tried to list the closest to the DFW area locations first:

<u>Japanese Gardens</u> – Fort Worth – Best time is around Thanksgiving

<u>Dinosaur Valley State Park</u> – near Glen Rose – Best time end of October to first of November

<u>Daingerfield State Park</u> – near Daingerfield - Piney woods area – Best time end of October to end of November

<u>Lake Bob Sandlin State Park</u> – near Pittsburg – Piney woods area– best time mid-October through mid-November

<u>Tyler State Park</u> – north of Tyler – best time late November through early December

Caddo Lake – near Uncertain – Piney woods area – best time end of October through late November

Garner State Park - near Concan - in the Hill Country area - Best time is late October

<u>Lost Maples</u> – Near Vanderpool - in the Hill country area – Best time is middle of November

McKinney Falls State Park - Hill Country area - best time late October through early November





<u>Contests</u>: It's a whole new year, and a fresh chance for our club to shine! The guidelines are a little dry, but here they are:

- Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict observations from all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archeology, in such a fashion that a well-informed person will be able to identify the subject material and to certify as to its honest presentation.
- The story telling value of a photograph must be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements enhance the nature story. The presence of scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals is permissible. Photographs of artificially produced hybrid plants or animals, mounted specimens, or obviously set arrangements, are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement.
- No techniques that add to, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content are permitted. All adjustments must appear natural. Color images can be converted to grayscale monochrome. Infrared images are not allowed.

Please size any images no larger than 1024 wide by 768 high and send them in email to anitaoak@outlook.com. (If images are in portrait orientation, they must still only be 768 pixels high.) Winners will be acknowledged during monthly meetings!
