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

October 2019 Field Trip To The Big Bend Country

Destination – Far West Texas! And what a destination it is! Not only did we find things to photograph along the way and in the National Park, but at least one of our members that I know of shot over 1,000 images on this adventure.


Twenty-four of us participated in this field trip and most of us departed the north Texas area on Saturday, October 19 some even left earlier (talk about anticipation??!!!).


Our first official overnight stop was Indian Lodge in the Davis Mountains State Park. Fun knowing that we had occupied a large portion of their rooms! Dinner in Fort Davis at various locations was followed by a trip to the McDonald Observatory for a Star Party under some of the darkest night skies in the continental United States! For those who haven't enjoyed this experience, it's a fun way to learn about our universe. On-line tickets were purchased ahead of time then once exchanged for an orange sticker (indicating paid admission), many of us took advantage of their gift shop before joining the rest of our group waiting to be admitted into the seating area. After finding our chosen locations in the amphitheater, a park ranger introduced us to the program objectives then using a powerful laser, pointed to different constellations while giving specific information about each. We were told that there were 300 persons in attendance that evening – quite a crowd. And oh – I forgot to mention how very COLD it was in that crisp night air near the top of Mount Locke's 6,800 ft. elevation!

After the Star Party, several of our participants took advantage of the telescopes viewing targets pre-selected by the rangers and a few of our folks returned to the Davis Mountains State Park's Skyline Drive for chances to enjoy some astrophotography.

Sunday morning the drive continued through Marfa - for some, including the "Giant" display on Hwy 90, Shafter ghost town (lots of architectural photo ops!) and turning south at Presidio continuing from there on the spectacular FM 170 following alongside the Rio Grande Wild & Scenic River (a US Biosphere Reserve). The ooh's and aah's just kept coming with stops at El Polvo (an abandoned cavalry fort), Closed Canyon, The Contrabando on the banks of the river (once a movie set for eight or nine movies), the Hoodoos, Crow Town (the remains of a filming area for parts of the "Streets of Laredo", the sequel to "Lonesome Dove") surrounded by a stunning rock formation).

Our ultimate destination was the Big Bend National Park, the only national park in our system to have its own mountain range completely within the park - the Chisos Mountains. Comprised of 1,252 square miles of land (880,000 acres!), the park also encompasses the largest tracts of protected area of the Chihuahuan Desert topography and ecology in the United States.

For the following several days we would encounter each other at the Cottonwood Market (groceries!), various restaurants including High Sierra, the Starlight, and the restaurant in the Basin plus geographic sites within the park. We were unable to traverse the park as one "very large" group since parking for more than three or four cars at most of the locations just isn't available. Not to worry....there are plenty of hiking trails to enjoy, bumpy roads to explore, the fascinating Fossil Exhibit to investigate and scenic areas to photograph.....the Santa Elena Canyon, Grapevine Hills, Hot Springs, the Sierra del Carmen range, Boquillas Canyon, the Dorgan-Sublett ruins, Mule Ears and Ernst Tinaja.

Comments since returning mention more than once – "I have to come back!" The Big Bend part of Texas is definitely worth a return visit.


