SPEAKER: Thorarinn Jonsson

Our ability to host virtual Zoom meetings has given us the opportunity to find a new pool of presenters that don't necessarily have to be located in North Texas – July's presenter will be coming to us from Iceland!

Thorarinn (Thor) Jonsson is a native Icelandic photographer who has been taking pictures since he was a child. He started with using film, and was able to participate in local camera clubs while in elementary school and into college. It was in college that he was able to learn how to develop film in the darkroom.

Life happened in his late teenage years, and he ended up taking a break from his photography. After his children were born in the early 2000's, he invested in the purchase of his first digital camera. It was an immediate love connection with the new technology, and he went all-in when he found something that engaged his interest and brought him joy.

During this time of finding his passion in photography, he was working as a First Officer on a small fishing vessel. While out to sea, he read a lot of material on the mercurial weather conditions that occur and drive the ocean's behavior. This hard-learned knowledge has helped him in the leading and planning of many workshops and tours in various countries. All of these places had one thing in common: very interesting and complex weather systems that contribute to getting awesome images!

It was around 2010 when a few of Thor's friends, who had a shared interest in photography, decided to create a photography club in his hometown. Thor signed up and, soon enough, became a Board Member – a position he still holds today.

Thor took a giant leap in his career in 2014 by deciding to create his own company "Thor Photography" with his wife. While he has been fortunate to have had the ability to travel and teach around the world, he finds it most rewarding to concentrate on sharing his experience and knowledge of Iceland's beautiful coastlines, stunning interior Highlands, and memorable water features found throughout his homeland country.

"Thor Photography" is still a small family owned company, as Thor says he really enjoys keeping his groups small – "where people normally meet as strangers, but leave as friends".

Thor's presentation will be about some of his global images taken while he is on his tours. He will be talking to us about how he planned for the picture taken, the sources he used for the planning, how to get the information about the locations, and the techniques used to capture the images. To wrap things up, Thor will review the software and plugins he uses to edit his pictures.



Field Trip News

We had our first filed trip since March on June 6. A group of us met at the Hagerman NWR. We started at the butterfly garden then walked the Harris Creek Trail. We had a nice walk; it was good to get out of our quarantine. Here are two images from the trip.







November 6-7-8, 2020 Field Trip Caddo Lake Uncertain, TX

The focus of this field trip is to photograph the brilliant fall colors at Caddo Lake. We can't control mother nature, but the boat captain I am working with assured me we have a good chance of having great color. We will be offering sunset trips Friday and Saturday evenings and sunrise trips Saturday and Sunday mornings. Each trip will be two hours in duration. Each trip will be \$40.

Different from how we normally do things: For this trip, will need a firm commitment of interest <u>NO LATER</u> <u>THAN AUGUST 14 (our August meeting)</u> in order to ensure that we have enough boats for the tours! This is a busy season for the boats!

What will we see???

Caddo Lake in all its splendor.....water, Spanish moss, cypress trees, lily pads, lilies (2 varieties of lilies and one lotus we're told!), wildlife (birds, beavers, alligators....)

What is the cost?

\$40 per person for each:

\$40/pp for sunset boat tour \$40/pp for sunrise boat tour

ALL PAID UP-FRONT THE WEEK BEFORE WE GET TO CADDO LAKE. Payment instructions will be provided at a later date.

Why \$40......I see rates showing \$25/pp.....???

The \$40 keeps us on the water for two hours (\$25 shown on websites is for one hour).

Each boat will be limited to 6 passengers + the captain to allow adequate room.

When is it? November 6-7-8, 2020

<u>How far is it?</u> About 3 hours from McKinney – please check googlemaps.com from your location. Destination: Uncertain, TX (where we meet the boats) or Jefferson, TX (one option for lodging)

What's the schedule?

The schedule of boat departure times and departure locations will be announced later. This is after daylight savings ends Sunrise is about 6:50 am and sets around 5:30 pm.

What else is there to photograph?

The Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge An 8,493-acre protected area of Texas managed by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System. It is located along Caddo Lake in East Texas

Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge – there is a six-mile-long driving trail offering native grasses, birdhouses, feeders, duck boxes and bat houses/nurseries. Many wildlife observation areas on the refuge. Over 216 recorded resident and migratory bird species.

You are welcome to enjoy the many open paved and gravel roads within the refuge as they are great for wildlife watching and hiking. An old railroad right-of-way is today a 9-mile nature trail. In addition to the Wildlife Observation Trail, several shorter trails are available for your enjoyment.

Free of charge, seven days a week from sunrise to sunset. Come prepared! Mosquitoes and deer flies can be abundant, so insect repellent is recommended. Be on the look-out for poison ivy.

<u>Historic downtown Jefferson</u> – for those who wish to photograph non-nature related items, you'll find architecture, historic buildings, antique stores and their "wares".

Lodging Suggestions (we don't have a "where is everyone staying" location at this point):

<u>The Shady Glade Resort</u> in Uncertain offers several budget-friendly options: 2 cabins (with 2 double beds - \$ 99/night); five motel rooms w/2 double beds each - \$89/night double occupancy; and three manufactured homes with fully furnished kitchens (see website for # of bedrooms/baths and rates).

This is about 25 minutes from Jefferson and is across the road from the Shady Glade docks where we will meet the boats.

Kahn Hotel in Jefferson

Warmly decorated rooms feature flat-screen TVs and free Wi-Fi; some en-suite bathrooms have showers only. Suites have kitchens; an upgraded suite adds a balcony and a whirlpool tub. (Just a heads up: Stairs to the second floor rooms are steep and difficult to negotiate with luggage. The Kahn does not have an elevator and does not serve breakfast or other meals – coffee, sweet rolls only. Most of the rooms are interior and do not have windows. www.kahnsaloon.com or contact: Melanie 903/601-4434.

Zoom

For those of you not familiar with Zoom meetings here is a short "how to" for you to access our meeting. Current members will receive an email invite from Anita with the link and any other directions a few days before the meeting. It works best on a desktop or laptop computer, but you can also use an Ipad or smart phone. I would recommend trying to connect to the meeting 5 or 10 minutes before the meeting start time. Looking forward to seeing everyone on Zoom!

How to join a Zoom meeting on desktop via meeting invite link

- 1. Click on the meeting invite URL that the host shared via email or text.
- 2. Open the Zoom app.
- 3. Approve the request for permission to use your computer's audio and camera.

Depending on the meeting's set-up, you may enter the meeting right away, you may need to wait for the host to arrive first or you may be placed into a waiting room that the host controls.


