I know there are those of you who feel comfortable talking to anyone and those of you who, like me, are sometimes a little more reticent. 

Topic: Evaluating and Working with Light

Join San Luis Obispo, CA-based professional landscape and nature photographer Nic Stover for a LIVE Zoom to talk about Not too Heavy, Not too Light. Just right. Evaluating and work with light in Landscape Photography.

The work "photography" literally means "drawing with light" from the Greek words phos, (genitive: phōtós) meaning "light", and graphê meaning "drawing or writing". There are so many ways to think about the different types of light within our photography and what we can do with what we get in the field but also when we get back in front of our computer to process our images we "harvested" in the field.

These topics we will review will help you to evaluate what images we might want to select for our portfolios, see some simple ways to correct minor distractions in post and give you greater confidence to express yourself in new ways and to work with light differently.

In this presentation Nic will talk about how the most important thing in photography is you and how you look through the light harvester (IE the camera) and the choices and decisions you make on how to collect the light that is falling in front of you onto your subjects of choice. Nic doesn't have mastery of light nor the power to control it but he will talk about what he CAN control is how he reacts to the light he is given, not the light he wants, but the light he is given. Nic considers the science and study of light to be one of our most important pursuits in photography. This presentation will increase your understanding of how to work with light.

Some of the topics covered in this presentation include but are not limited to:

- 1. New ways to think about light.
- 2. Discovering how we view light vs how our camera (light harvester) views light.
- 3. Exploring how the viewers eye moves through your images from the warms and cools to the brights and darks.
- 4. Discover the true value of light in our images.
- 5. Learn how do photographers describe and talk about light.
- 6. Further your understanding of the ways in which light interacts with our scenes.
- 7. Develop the skills so you can you most effectively use light in your images.
- 8. Find new ways you can break out of your normal mode of working with light.



All subjects interest me

BUD MALLAR

is this month's featured club member.

I'm <u>Bud Mallar</u>, been into photography since the 50's, which makes me old, and a former user of film, Polaroid and early Sony digital.

I shoot with Canon gear, mostly because someone had old Canon lenses they would give me for free if I stuck with Canon.

I shoot what interests me when I see it. A flower, a bug, a reflection, a smile, an event, a moment. I'm a jack of all trades and not a specialist photographer and I enjoy taking pictures. But I don't do very well creatively with assigned subjects, like contests or weekly challenges.

I have 'good' equipment, using my Tamron 16-300 mm almost exclusively. Partly because I can't afford the 'pro' gear and f/2 lenses, but partly because I've learned how to 'get' what I want with what I have.

I know most of the photography rules, have to, if for no other reason than I teach Fundamental Photography for Heard, Plano and Dallas clubs, but I don't always follow them. I probably do a lot of things differently than other photographers. I've found what works for me.

I pay attention to rules which help me create 'better' images; those which make me feel, remember, question and/or wonder.

In the Air Force I taught people how to fly and later, while supporting a large mainframe data center, I taught folks how to 'use' computers. Now, I take pictures, so I teach that. I enjoy helping people learn, to hopefully make complex technical 'stuff' simple so as to improve understanding and retention.

I constantly wish to capture 'better' images, which I define as images which make me feel, remember, question and/or wonder, although, like all of us, I'm a documentarian too often.

I believe in community service and have been a volunteer to help many organizations and individuals meet their photographic needs.

But I also preach: to have fun, experiment, to make use of various options of your camera's capabilities, to 'make great' what is in front of you with what you have with you, to shoot other than your favorite subjects, to let your camera do the work, that better gear doesn't necessarily make for better images, to get it right in the camera, to consider it isn't always about creating a contest winner, but about how you, others, feel when you see your images.

I shoot better with people around, sharing ideas, laughing, complaining about the cold, starting or ending with food and wine, learning from them, seeing different points of view, or helping if asked. Larry Petterborg and I 'organize' weekly group shoots, partly to get folks out and shooting after Covid restrictions, but partly just to shoot with others and have fun.

In the big scheme of things, be it flowers, a singer, a senior class portrait, a sunset, an event, we each have to find what photographically works easiest and best for us to capture what we see, what we feel, as the moment may quickly pass.

I want to take pictures, not constantly fidget with the controls. That's work, not fun.

I've won some contests, done well on others, been told: my pictures were dark and muddy; I need to have more depth of field; get a center of interest; to follow rules; that I have a great eye; "oooh", "neat picture" and hugged in thanks.

I listen, I consider, adjust when it helps, but continue to shoot what I like, in the style I like, and hope all you do the same. It makes you feel good all under.

FIELD TRIPS

CADDO LAKE December 3,4,5

Our Caddo Lake field trip is full, and you may be waitlisted if you request that trip.

The club will be traveling to Caddo Lake to photograph brilliant fall colors of the largest bald cypress forest in the world. It is possible to photograph Caddo Lake from the shore, but it is not the best way. Most of the banks are located on private land and closed to the public. The best way to photograph the lake is by boat. We will have four boat tours scheduled, two sunrise tours, two sunset tours based out of the Shady Glade Marina located in Uncertain, TX. Members will have the freedom to choose some or all the tours.

The Basics

- Must be a current member of the Heard Nature Photography Club with a liability waiver on file to participate.
- Boat tours will depart from Shady Glade Marina, Uncertain TX
- Boat tours have been arranged for two sunset tours and two sunrise tours.
- Times
 - o Sunrise is approximately 7:00 am
 - o Sunset is approximately 5:10 pm
 - o New moon Saturday
 - o Exact boat departure times will be determined later but if you are planning to go on the Friday afternoon sunset tour you should plan to be at the dock no later than 3:00 pm.
- Group meals will be planned and announced later.
- Will need a firm commitment from everyone in September. I'll push the date as late as I can.

The boat tours


- Each boat tour will be two hours

ANITA OAKLEY: Plan your next photo trip



When you plan to go to a new area to photograph, it helps immensely to do some research. Learn about the lay of the land and the photographic opportunities in the vicinity. Sometimes that isn't so easy. You may search Google, Yahoo, or Bing for images, but they seldom tell you where they were taken or what time of day is best for that particular view. Plus you spend hours looking at different websites and making notes.

Here's a great way to make your research easier:


Photohound.co is a great site, created by photographers, for photographers, and accepting contributions from other photographers. (Yes, it's .co and not .com.) It accepts contributions from photographers all over the world, and the entries tell you not only where the images were made, but how to get there, what time of day is best, and what gear to take. The tag line says "Explore over 6,300 amazing photo spots and over 26,400 images in 134 countries and territories," and they aren't kidding!



Terree Stone and I are planning a trip to <u>Yellowstone</u> in October. Going to PhotoHound, I found 135 matching spots, many of which I had never heard of even though I've been to Yellowstone twice. Places like Cistern Spring, Sapphire Pool and Clepsydra Geyser were new to me.

Then when I clicked on the images I was happy to find detailed information about those locations, including about this spot, what to shoot, getting there, gear, and guides where you can get more information.

You may notice a request for images from Sapphire Pool in the screenshot above. This website is being improved and expanded all the time by photographers like us. For instance, they didn't have a section for <u>Caddo Lake</u>, so I created one, and after it was reviewed it was accepted for inclusion in PhotoHound. It's sort of like Wikipedia for photographers! I hope you check it out for your own trip planning!


