






My National Park Journey

Leica cameras are good for street photography and sometimes for landscape photography, but not for astrophotography.

Camper Selection

Normally, the RV or motor home would be the ideal method for a long road trip. Based on the following reasons, I have decided to make the decision to add a pop-up camper on a Toyota Tacoma.

- avoid driving big RV or motor home
- avoid towing a trailer or another car/Jeep
- capable to run some off-road trails if required
- lower center gravity, compact and low profile
- quicker set up to rest and fold back on the go

I purchased a new 2019 Toyota Tacoma TRD Off-Road long bed truck, and put my order of the new slide-in truck bed pop-up camper at the end of 2019. My new camper was eventually installed in June 2020.

I have had several road trips from July 2020 till August 2021 and have traveled over 15 States, 14 National Parks, 11 National Forests, 12 Wildlife Refuges/Areas, 11 Recreation Areas, 24 State Parks, and 4 National Monument/Grassland/Seashore/Landmark.

My wife has been with me on the first road trip to Teton, Yellowstone, and Glacier. She did not travel with me for the next few trips as she doesn't like cold weather. She also prefers a shorter trip. My road trips are solo for long periods of time, two to three months.

During my trips, I stayed in well maintained RV parks and campgrounds. However, I would normally prefer to do "boondocking" (dry camping) in a remote area so I can fall into nature to enjoy the solitude and take my photos. My camper is the Bobcat model made by All Terrain Camper (the same design concept as for the 4 Wheel Camper's Fleet model)

Racetrack Valley

It is recommended to use a high-clearance 2WD vehicle to drive through the 34-mile long Racetrack Valley Road to get to the Racetrack. I stay overnight at Homestate Dry Camp nearby the Racetrack.

Tuweep/Toroweep Overlook on the North Rim of the Grand Canyon

It is recommended to use a high-clearance 4x4 off-road vehicle to reach the <u>Toroweep Overlook</u>. I take the 61-mile long <u>Sunshine Route off from AZ State Route 389</u>. The last two-mile driving conditions are a litte rough as it is in a large flat boulder type of road. I stay at nearby <u>Tuweep Campground</u> for morning and night photography.

Thor's Well and Spouting Horn, Oregon

Thor's Well on the Oregon coast is a natural hole that seems to be draining the sea. The <u>Spouting Horn</u> is a salt water fountain driven by the ocean's power. The Horn puts on its best show at high tide and during winter storms. I visited the Oregon coast in July 2021 when the marine layer condition stays on the coast most of the summertime. There is almost no sunrise or sunset to view as the sky is covered by a cloud layer.

Grosvenor Arch

<u>Grosvenor Arch</u> is two sandstone arches towering 150 ft/45m above the ground located in the northwester corner of the <u>Grand Staircase Escalante National Monument</u>. I camp in nearby <u>Kodachrome Basin State Park</u> to take photos of the Arch in the morning and at night.

Loess Bluff National Wildlife Refuge, Missouri

I have located this wildlife refuge (near <u>St. Joseph</u>, <u>MO</u>) where I plan my winter trip for bald eagle photography. The refuge is just on the way to <u>Lock and Dam No. 14</u> (<u>Le Claire, IA</u>) which is a very popular dam for viewing bald eagles.

The peak number of bald eagles (two to three hundred) staying in the refuge is during December when thousands of snow geese are also migrating to the refuge. The bald eagles will catch the snow geese for their food. I visit in late January when there are about 50 bald eagles at the site. However, i am not disappointed because I can view either bald eagles or other wildlife. I highly recommend visiting this refuge, especially during the wintertime.
